

Live in Loch Goil – Scout Accommodation

Booking Terms & Conditions

With no camping facilities in Lochgoilhead, we are delighted to have agreed a partnership with our neighbours at Scout Adventures. Located just a 1-minute walk from our festival site, this offers budget shared lodge & bunk accommodation which would normally be used for their groups - similar to youth hostel/ bunkhouse accommodation. We have also secured 10 campervan spots.

WHAT'S INCLUDED WITH ROOM BOOKINGS:

- A room within a shared lodge (each room has either 2 or 4 single beds).
- There are 3 lodges available - Each lodge has 6 rooms, with a total of 16 beds per lodge.
- Bedding, pillow & linen. **Please note your bed will be required to be made up by you on arrival and stripped by you before departure.** You will need your own towels.
- Shared toilets & shower facilities (in each lodge).
- A cooked breakfast with tea / coffee served each morning from 9-10am in the dining room.
- To comply with the Scout Adventures fire policy, **lodges & rooms are not locked**, so please do not leave any valuables in your room as we cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage. There will be staff from Scout Adventures on site for the duration of the weekend.

WHAT'S INCLUDED WITH CAMPERVAN BOOKINGS:

- Designated reserved space within the Scout Adventure grounds, just a 1-minute walk to our festival site.
- Access to shared toilets & shower facilities.
- Waste disposal unit.
- You can come and go from the grounds as you like to explore the area, your space will be reserved.

WHAT'S NOT INCLUDED WITH BOOKINGS:

- Towels.
- Kitchen facilities for self-catering.
- Washing or drying facilities for clothes.
- Electric hook ups.

FAQ

1. Where is Scouts Adventures?

Scout Adventures is located directly behind our festival site with the entrance located on Hall Road, immediately after the multi court. The full address is:
Scout Adventures Hall Road Lochgoilhead PA24 8AQ

2. What time is check in / check out?

Check in is from 4pm Friday. Check out is by 10am Monday.

3. Where is breakfast served?

Breakfast will be served each morning from 9am-10am in the dining room, less than a 1-minute walk from each lodge and will be signposted.

4. Is there WiFi available?

There is no wifi but most mobile signals work well in the Lochgoilhead area with EE and Vodaphone being the strongest.

5. **Are fires or BBQ's allowed on the grounds?**
Strictly no fires or BBQ's on the Scout or Festival grounds.
6. **Can I bring my dog?**
Our festival site is not suitable for dogs, so no pets including dogs, (except guide dogs).
7. **Are the lodges accessible?**
Certain rooms within the lodges are accessible. These are available on a first come first served basis, so please contact us before booking.
8. **Is smoking allowed?**
Smoking is strictly prohibited within the grounds of Scout Adventures. Anyone caught breaching this rule will be asked to leave with no refunds given. Smoking within the facilities would trigger the alarms, which would also result in a £250 fine for breaching the rules, as well as being asked to leave without a refund.
9. **Will there be any outdoor activities available during the weekend?**
This has still to be confirmed.

DEPOSIT:

Each booking requires a £100 deposit on booking. This will be returned within 48-hours of check out, assuming you and your group have abided by our rules, terms and conditions. Failure to abide by the rules could lead to loss of deposit and you being asked to leave the premises with no refunds given. If any damage caused exceeds the deposit amount, you will be liable for this.

RULES:

Scout Adventures is widely used all year round by groups from all over Scotland. We are delighted to enter a partnership with them for our festival and hope to build on this going forward. We ask that all our users respect the grounds, the staff, other guests and the rules always. Your co-operation is appreciated and will help us to continue improving our festival.

RESIDENTIAL AREA:

With the location being within a residential area, we ask that you respect our neighbours and keep noise after 11pm to a minimum. The local pub will be open late each night and we ask that you are conscious of your noise levels on the way back to your accommodation from the pub, as you pass residential property.

WASTE:

We are lucky to have such a stunning location for our festival, please help keep it beautiful by disposing of your waste in the correct bins.

MUSIC:

Please respect the other guests and don't play loud music in the rooms or outside of campervans, especially after 10pm each night. Music at a respectable level before 10pm is allowed.
